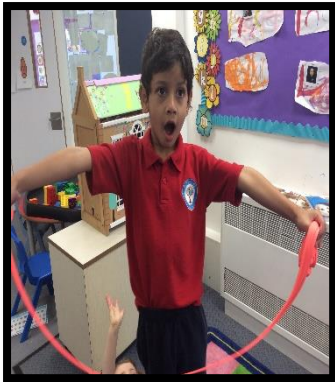
Welcome to our Early Years Foundation Stage. Children who come to us in the Early Years phase of schooling will usually have already attended a nursery setting and/ or a Child Development Centre. The local authority will name our school in your child's Education, Health and Care Plan.



- Once you receive confirmation of your placement from the Local Authority, our Early Years teacher will meet your child in their current education setting to meet them and find out all about their likes, dislikes and needs.
- We will arrange with you a home visit which allows us to complete all the necessary admission paperwork, finding out as much as possible about your child to ensure we have all the information we need to settle them into school.
- We will use your child's EHCP to inform goal setting. Professionals working with your child will hand over to the new team to ensure consistency.
- We will be delighted to invite your child to school for some 'stay and play' sessions to see their new classroom and meet their new friends and teachers.
- To help your child prepare for their new school placement we will provide a photo book to allow them to learn about their new school.
- We strongly believe that all of this helps us to build a clear picture of your child to provide a smooth transition for them into big school!

# What do the children learn in our Early Years Foundation Stage?



All EYFS classes within the SPT offer the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum. This allows us to meet the learning needs of our youngest children in developmentally appropriate ways with a curriculum which can be tailored to meet their learning needs. Our EYFS offer allows children to learn through play and exploration.



**Our curriculum focuses upon the 3 prime areas of learning:**

Communication & Language,  
Personal, Social & Emotional Development  
Physical Development

**We additionally deliver the four specific areas which provide important contexts for learning:**

Literacy  
Mathematics  
Understanding the World  
Expressive Arts and Design

# The prime areas of the EYFS curriculum

The prime areas of the curriculum will be the main focus of your child's time in their Reception year and throughout Year 1. Delivery of these areas helps us to prepare your child for future learning and for their transition into Key Stage 1. The foundations of behaviour, communication and learning behaviours laid in our Early Years phase of schooling are vital in supporting them on their future journey through the school.

## Communication and language

This area of the curriculum is broken down into the following sub areas - **Listening and Attention, Understanding and Speaking.**



This area will be a major focus area for the majority of children entering the school setting, and will be taught across the whole of the school day.

To ensure our children develop their communication skills our Early Years class is a total communication environment with children experiencing specialist methods such as **PECS, Makaton signing, Intensive Interaction, communication books**, and the use of photos, symbols and **objects of reference**. We use any advice and guidance received from members of multi-agency teams, such as **Speech and Language Therapists**, when they are involved with your child. We also have our own specialist intervention support team.

## Personal, Social and Emotional Development

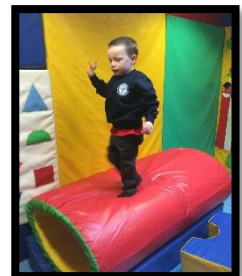
This area of the curriculum is broken down into the following sub areas-

**Making Relationships, Self-confidence and Self-awareness and Managing Feelings and Behaviour.**



Again this will be woven throughout the school day and additionally children will be working on specific interventions such as **TACPAC** and **Intensive Interaction** aimed at developing relationships and social interaction skills. Lots of learning will be delivered through play – sharing is a skill that we find ourselves working on all the time!

**Physical Development** This area of the curriculum is broken down into the following sub areas – **Moving and Handling** and **Self Help Skills**.



Moving and handling in this area involves PE skills and will also include working on the children's **physiotherapy plans** and any work set out in a child's **occupational therapy plan**. We are keen to develop the children's independence and will set targets that are developmentally appropriate. We also do rebound therapy on the big trampoline and have timetabled sessions in the soft play room as well as a weekly swim in our hydro pool.

The Specific areas of the curriculum will also be part of your child's curriculum during their time in Reception and Year 1. Many of the activities and experiences that your child encounters during their Early Years schooling will cross more than one area and we track delivery to ensure that our curriculum is broad and balanced.

## Understanding the World

This area of the curriculum is broken down into the following sub areas – **People and Communities, The World and Technology.**



Teaching activities in this curriculum area provide children with the opportunity to develop the knowledge, skills and understanding that help them to make sense of the world, to support them to become confident members of their community. We go out on weekly welly walks to explore our local environment.

## Expressive Art and Design

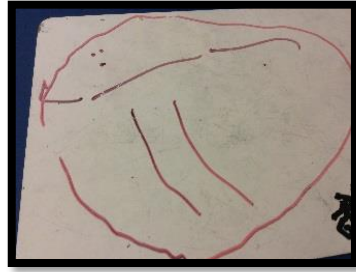
This area of the curriculum is broken down into the following sub areas **Exploring and Using, Media and Materials and Being Imaginative.**



Included in this area of the curriculum is art, design, music, dance and role play. Sensory exploration has vital links to the development of skills in other areas including mark making and food tolerances.

## Literacy

This area of the curriculum is broken down into the following sub areas – **Reading** and **Writing**.



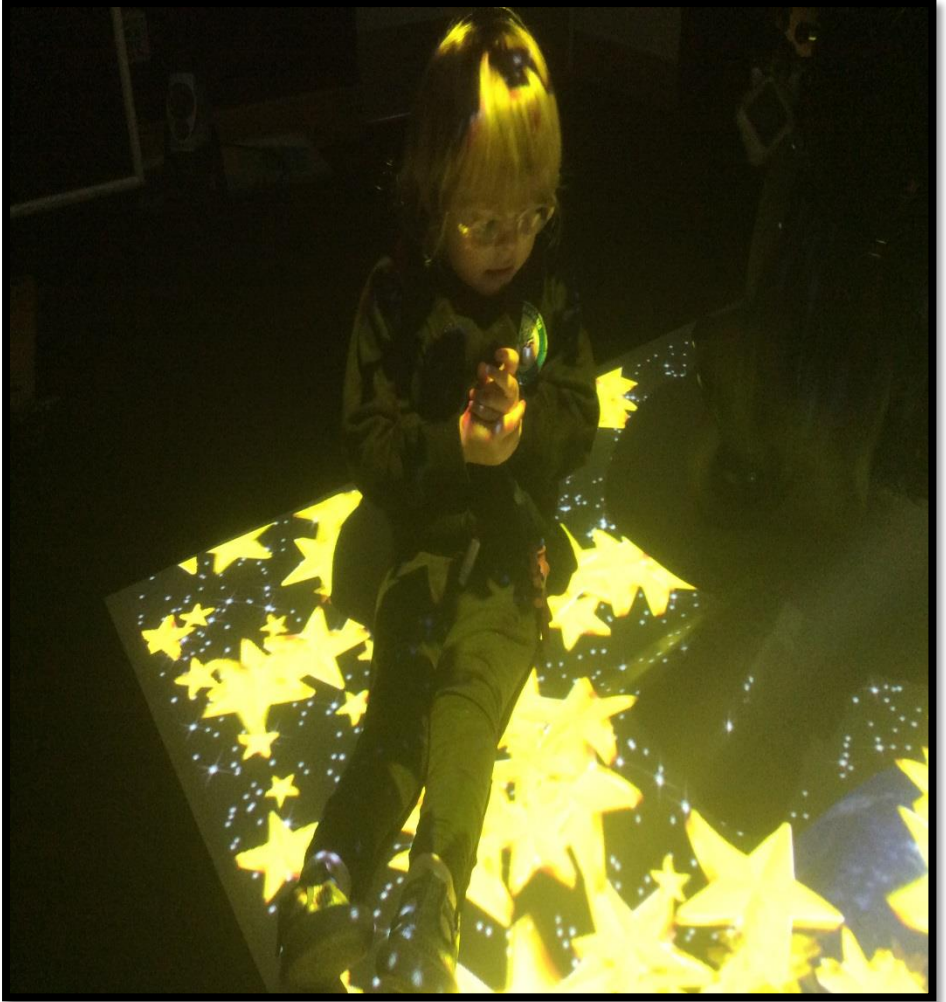
Fostering a love of books, stories and rhymes is essential to motivate our youngest children to achieve to the best of their ability. Introducing a sensory element to stories, rhymes and mark making enhances their experiences making them more enjoyable, meaningful and

## Maths

This area of the curriculum is broken down into the following sub areas – **Number** and **Shape, Space and Measure**.



The children learn an awareness of number through rhymes, sorting, counting and organising, measuring, cooking and weighing both inside and outside. We explore shapes and their properties and learn about measure through sand and water play.

# Working in partnership with parents

Our partnership with you and your family is vital in allowing us to secure the very best outcomes for your child while they are in our school. We will send home a daily diary to ensure that you know what your child has learned each day and we will respect your wishes to provide any other information that is important to you, for example information about what your child has eaten in school.



Throughout the year we will **invite you in to school for specific events** such as Christmas performances and coffee afternoons. We will also host activity related events such as reading together on World Book Day.

You will be invited to parent evenings and these meetings will also be an opportunity to support us in setting challenging and appropriate targets for your child's personalised Learning Goals, linked to the 4 areas of their EHCP. Your input into the **Education, Health and Care Plan** meeting is vital in ensuring that the plan continues to accurately reflect your child's strengths, areas of needs and to set targets that will guide us in providing the **best quality educational experience**.
